The Fall 2018 *FolioFest* panel of judges is looking for outstanding ePortfolios. All submissions must be made by November 26. Any work submitted before November 16 will get feedback for improvement and resubmission. Make sure the "Permissions & Share" setting for the work you submit is set to "Public" or "Private within University of Virginia". Contact us at eportfolios@virginia.edu if you have any questions.

Categories

1. **Academic ePortfolio:** Shows your achievements as a student at UVa. It could begin with work developed for one or more courses (multi-disciplinary work, or work done across several semesters or years). Content should not be limited to curricular work, but extend to extra-curricular, community service, and personal interests and hobbies.
2. **Professional ePortfolio:** Some people refer to this as an "e-resume". The idea is that, unlike a CV or resume where items are simply listed, the professional ePortfolio also shows actual work done, reviews, assessments, and/or testimonials received, and anything else that helps show you as a professional (personal philosophy, work ethic) and a real person (community service, personal interests and hobbies, etc.).
3. **Creative ePortfolio:** This category is completely open and up to you. Typically, the ePortfolio is artistic, entertaining, or generally unique in its take on a topic. But it could also be very personal and subjective (keeping in mind the panel of judges as the audience).

The panel has also set the following minimum requirements for an ePortfolio to qualify. While the language used in the ePortfolio is not restricted, the sections listed below must be in English:

Minimum Requirements

- A **Home Page:** This page introduces the ePortfolio. It might briefly mention who you are, explain why you created the ePortfolio, and highlight some of the key features readers might want to pay special attention to. Note, however, that the information on this page is not about you. It's about the ePortfolio itself.
- An **About Me Page:** This is the page that is about you. Who are you? What should the reader know about you to fully appreciate the ePortfolio? Some like to introduce themselves with a video. But a picture, or at least an image that represents you in the context of the ePortfolio is a positive touch.
- A **Final Reflections Page:** The ePortfolio reader wants to know what it was like to put this work together. This is your chance to honestly (and constructively) assess your work. This may also be a good time to look ahead. What else can you do with this ePortfolio? What's next?
- A **Contact Info Page:** This is self-explanatory.
